



Permit Details

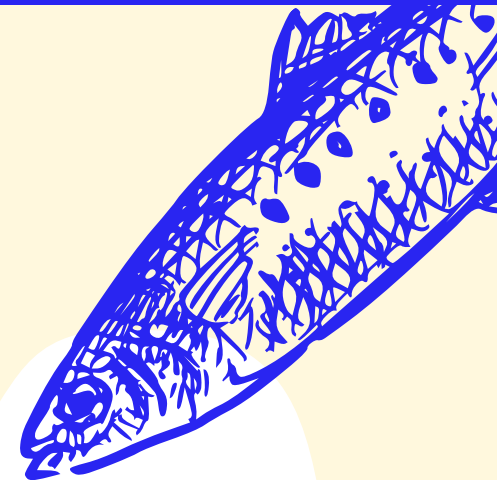
- Cost: \$12.00
- Validity: One year from the date of issue.
- Permit Area: The permit is only valid for fishing on Andersen Air Force Base (AAFB) property, not anywhere else on Guam.
- Special Access Pass: A pass is issued with the permit and must be displayed on the vehicle's windshield when parked in the Tarague Basin area.
- Guests: A permit holder may have up to four sponsored guests, who must remain in the presence and close proximity of the permit holder.
- Equipment: Each permit holder and guest is allowed a maximum of two fishing poles.
- Revocation: The permit can be revoked at any time for violations of the rules and guidelines.

Map and Area Access

The provided map outlines the authorized and restricted areas for access:

- Authorized Access: Access is generally permitted along the coast from Tarague Beach to Pati Beach.
- Restricted Areas (No Entry):
 - Active Landfill
 - EOD (Explosive Ordnance Disposal) Range
 - Small Arms Firing Range
 - Pati Point Cliffline Areas
 - Northwest Field

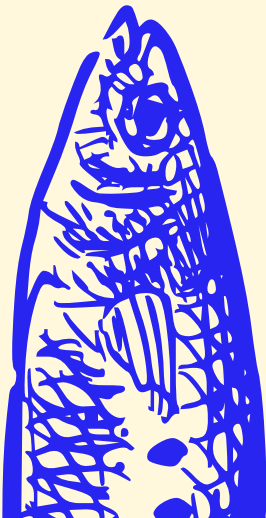

General Rules

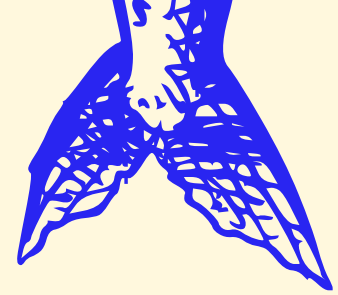
- **Parking:** Vehicles must be parked in designated areas or within 15 feet of a paved road.
- **Prohibited Items/Activities:**
 - Spear fishing is prohibited in all AAFB-controlled waters.
 - Possession of spears, spear guns, or nets within 20 meters inland of the high tide mark is prohibited.
 - All methods of net fishing and "chumming" are prohibited.
 - The use of gaffs, shell collecting, gleaning, and removal of sand or rocks is strictly prohibited within the Tarague Basin and Pati Point Marine Preserve.
 - While fishing, water entry is NOT ALLOWED
- **Boats:** No boat or floating craft of any type may be launched from any beach on Andersen Air Force Base.



Protected Species

- Do not interfere with sea turtles or their nesting activities.
- Sharks and rays may not be taken or removed. If caught, they must be released immediately and without injury.
- **Commercial Use:** No specimen caught in the Tarague Basin may be sold or used for commercial purposes.
- **Flashlights:** Must be low-density LED flashlights.
- **Tarague Basin** is protected and is a natural and marine preserve. All Federal and Local Laws apply

All stated rules and guidelines are in accordance with Andersen AFB Instruction 36ABWI 32-2003. Guam Laws 31-10, 24-21, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 63 and Title 16 Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations, Chapter 2.



Fishing Locations and Times

- **On-Shore Fishing:** Hook and line fishing is permitted 24 hours a day from the shore, stretching from the Northwest end of Tarague Beach to Pati Recreational Beach.
- **Prohibited Fishing Areas:**
 - Fishing is not allowed within 50 feet of or inside the buoyed swim zones.
 - The area beyond Pati Beach is the Explosive Ordnance Disposal Range and is off-limits.
- **Trolling:** Trolling is permitted from the reef margins seaward at Tarague Beach and outside the Pati Point Marine Preserve, but only for pelagic fish (fish found in the open sea). Non-pelagic fish must be released immediately.
